PASSENGERSHIPS CRUISING IN THE MEDITERRANEAN (1)

The Mediterranean is a popular area for cruising in Europe, a lot of cruise vessel are operating on several routes and visiting the most popular ports in Italy, Greece, Croatia, Spain and North Africa. You can find in the Mediterranean large cruise vessels for mass entertainment or smaller ones for more cozy cruising with less passengers onboard, but with a lot of attention of the staff onboard.



Old and new ships as can be seen as on the picture above, on the left side the large in 1996 build **COSTA VICTORIA** and on the right the 1956 build **TOPAZ**, both vessel moored at the cruise terminal at the port of Palma de Mallorca October 24th 2002.



The Panamanian flagged TOPAZ which is at present in charter for THOMSON which is a part of the TUI group was build under the name EMPRESS OF BRITAIN and sailed under the names QUEEN ANNA MARIA , CARNIVALE , FIESTA MARINA and OLYMPIC this vessel is one of the older vessels and charter to end in May 2003

The COSTA VICTORIA was build during 1996 at the Bremer Vulkan Yard in Germany and measures 76.000 GRT, is 251 mtr long and can carry more then 2000 passengers, the crew onboard is about 800.

One of the latest additions is the A'ROSA BLU which is laying at the port of NAPELS at the picture left, this ship can be recognized easily with the large red rose and lips painted on the bow, this ship was build under the name **CROWN PRINCESS** and was converted during June 2002 at the Lloyd Werft into the A'ROSA BLU, it was a very large conversion, costing Euro 35 million which

The **TRITON** was build at the Rotterdam Dydock Company in Rotterdam (Holland) under the name **CUNARD ADVENTURER**, was later renamed in **SUNWARD II** and is now cruising around under the name **TRITON**

for Royal Olympic Cruises.

On the picture left the **TRITON** is moored in the port of Genua with in the background the **EUROPEAN STARS**,



The **EUROPEAN STARS** owned by **FESTIVAL Cruises**. The **EUROPEAN STARS** is the latest addition to the Festival Fleet, she was inaugurated in April 2002 in Barcelona and is the first modern

cruise ship to operate year-round cruising in the Med, offering weekly departures from Genoa, Marseilles and Barcelona through December 7 and then operating 10-day sailings from Genoa to the Canary Islands and Morocco until March 27, 2003.

The **EUROPEAN STARS** boosted the Festival fleet to six vessels with a total capacity of 6600 passengers, the vessel is build at Chantiers de l'Atlantique, the 58.700 grt 1566 berth ship is the **EUROPEAN VISION** and flies the Italian flag.

The **COSTA TROPICALE** of COSTA CROCIERE which is build under the name **TROPICALE** during 1982, the vessel sailed for Carnival Cruises until the vessel was purchased by Costa, Costa Grociere is also a part of the Carnival Group, at the picture the vessel is departing from the port of Palma de Mallorca Thursday October 24th, 2002.

The MELODY was build during 1982 and started her life as the ATLANIC was later renamed in STARSHIP ATLANTIC and is now named MELODY, at present the vessel is operated by MSC (Mediterranean Shipping Company)



The **COSTA MARINA** started her life as the container vessel **AXEL JOHNSON** which was build during 1969 later the vessel was renamed **REGENT SUN** in 1986, the same year she was renamed **ITALIA** and during 1990, after purchasing this vessel by COSTA the vessel was converted passenger vessel **COSTA MARINA**, this vessel has a sistership named **COSTA ALLEGRA** which will be highlighted in a special later during November.

At the picture above the **COSTA MARINA** moored at the cruise terminal in the port of Napels.
